External Perspective II: C -> B



#### Concept of Pluralism

Diana Eck, Harvard University, Pluralism Project

- Energetic engagement with diversity diversity is a given, but pluralism is an achievement
- Active seeking of understanding across lines tolerance is a necessary public virtue but a too thin foundation
- Encounter of commitments
  Pluralism is not relativism, holding our deepest differences, not in isolation, but in relationship to one another
- Based on dialogue

Dialogue means both speaking and listening, and that process reveals both common understandings and real differences. Dialogue does not mean everyone at the "table" will agree with one another. Pluralism involves the commitment to being at the table — with one's commitments.








